# FAMILY CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS - Civil Practice Pathway

In addition to the General Certificate Requirements you must complete the following requirements to earn your certificate.

## CORE I

Required Fundamental Courses: Students must successfully complete these two:

Perspectives on Family Law (4 credits)

Child Parent & State (3 credits)

## CORE II

Required Advanced Courses: Students must successfully complete at least one of the following:

Adoption Child Support Collaborative Law Domestic Violence Law of Sex& Sexual Orientation Guardianship (to be added)

## CORE III

Experiential Learning: Students are encouraged to take both, only one is required:

Clinic: (any of the following) Family Advocacy Clinic; IPVAC; Mediation Clinic Externships: any family law externship but Eighth Circuit Family Court strongly recommended.

Plus one of the following:

Cross Cultural Counseling Interviewing, Counseling and Negotiation or ICN3 Negotiation &/or Mediation Pre-Trial Practice Trial Practice

### Electives

In addition to the courses listed above, the following electives may be used to complete the required 20 credits or, in appropriate cases, substituted for a comparable required course with the Director's approval.

Administrative Law Economics of the Family Elder Law Estate Planning Estates and Trusts Gender and the Law Immigration Law Law of Sex and Sexual Orientation Race and Race Relations Law Statutory Interpretation Unified Family Court (when taught)

### **Graduate Courses**

Students may also take graduate courses elsewhere in the university that enhance interdisciplinary skills, e.g., in Psychology, Family Youth and Community Sciences) deemed by the Director to be appropriate based on the student's overall record and goals may be added to this list. This may include appropriate graduate level courses 5000 and above in other departments or colleges.

### Seminar and Writing Requirement

Students must successfully complete an advanced writing project or other approved project (such as a family law brief, advocacy family-related public policy et.) seminar, or in another seminar or independent study approved by the Director. Family Policy, Child Support, and Law of Sex and Sexual Orientation Seminar, family law civil practice paper or other related subject in other seminars, with approval from the Director.
