

UF LAW BINDING DECISION OPTION

2025

Applicants for Fall 2025 admission may apply through the UF Law Binding Decision option if they will have completed all the academic work required to receive a bachelor's degree by May 2025.

Option Description:

- The Binding Decision application option is designed for applicants who are certain that UF Law is their first choice. Admissions decisions are binding; students admitted through this option will be required to submit a binding enrollment commitment form within one week of being admitted. If you are not sure about your choice of law school, you should apply for regular admission.
- Binding Decision may increase your chance of being accepted.
- Applicants admitted under the Binding Decision option will be considered for merit scholarships but are not guaranteed a scholarship award. You should only apply through the Binding Decision option if you are willing to enroll at UF Law even if you do not receive a scholarship.
- Applicants admitted through the Binding Decision option will not have to pay the \$200 non-refundable enrollment deposit.
- Candidates applying through the Binding Decision option will have their applications reviewed on the same timeline as Regular Decision candidates. This is not an early action program.

Eligibility:

Applicants applying through the Binding Decision option must have completed all of the academic work required to *receive a bachelor's degree by May 2025*, and must provide to UF Law through LSAC a final transcript showing the conferral of the bachelor's degree as soon as it is available and prior to enrollment.

Instructions:

- Submit your **complete** application through LSAC (select the *UF Law Binding Decision option*) by February 15, 2025. Complete applications will include all required parts, per application instructions.

Obligations if admitted:

- Confirm your enrollment under the Binding Decision option by submitting a Binding Enrollment Commitment Form within 7 days of our admission offer.
 - Withdraw applications to all other law schools, regardless of the decision, or lack thereof, received, and forward copies to UF Law of all email withdrawal notices sent to these law schools within 14 days of our admission offer.
 - Do not initiate new applications to other law schools.
- Authorize UF Law to share information about your binding decision commitment with other law schools and with the LSAC.
- Enroll in UF Law in August 2025.
