COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES:

More than half the lawyers in the United States are engaged in transactional practice. This class introduces you to contract drafting and transactional practice by covering common conventions for drafting provisions and organizing contracts, drafting contracts from scratch and using precedents, negotiating contract provisions, drafting authority documents for a closing, and using Artificial Intelligence and various online services to draft contracts and do the other things involved in transactional practice.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

At the end of this course, you should be able to: (1) prepare to draft a contract by familiarizing yourself with the client's business and applicable law; (2) conduct a client interview, soliciting the information for the proposed transaction or relationship; (3) draft a purchase agreement and/or term contract from scratch following the conventions in a textbook; (4) add value to a contract by considering contingencies and using legal mechanisms to better protect the client's interests; (5) apply caselaw and/or statutory law to contract provisions; (6) tailor and revise complex form documents; (7) negotiate contract provisions; (8) draft a certificate and vote for an individual signing a contract for a corporation; (9) understand what Artificial Intelligence and other online services and software platforms are available to assist with contract drafting; and (10) draft a contract amendment.

REQUIRED READING MATERIALS:

The required textbook for all Legal Drafting courses at UF is *Drafting Contracts: How and Why Lawyers Do What They Do* (third edition) by Tina Stark & Monica Llorente. I will provide you with a supplement for this topic. Please also be sure to register for the Canvas page for this course. You are responsible for checking the Canvas page and the e-mail connected to the page on a regular basis for any class announcements or adjustments, including any updates or changes to this syllabus.

COURSE EXPECTATIONS AND GRADING EVALUATION:

- A. <u>Weekly Assignments</u>. This course requires the completion of outside of class of homework assignments based on the readings in the textbook and several graded drafting projects.
- B. Grade Calculation. You will be evaluated based upon the following:

Class participation and homework assignments	10% of Grade
First Contract drafted from scratch	20% of Grade
Second Contract drafted from scratch	20% of Grade
Final Take Home Drafting Project	50% of Grade

You are expected to participate in class. If you don't participate voluntarily, I will likely "cold call" on you. If you still don't participate, your final grade may be reduced by up to 5% (1% each time that happens). Homework assignments that are not timely completed before class are also subject to a deduction of up to 5% (1% for each assignment not turned in).

CLASS ATTENDANCE AND MAKEUP POLICY:

Attendance in class is required by both the ABA and the Law School. Attendance will be taken at each class meeting. Students are allowed two absences during the course of the semester.
