#### **REQUIRED:**

- <u>COURSE MATERIALS</u>. Available on Canvas. I will initially post materials required for MODULES ONE through FIVE. I encrypt all materials for MODULES FOUR and beyond. You will receive decryption information <u>after the drop-add period</u>, once the roll is final. UF places you into Canvas: I have <u>nothing</u> to do with it. If you add the course, the process may take a day or two. Nothing is due during the drop-add period, so do not fear getting behind. Relax.
- <u>ADOBE READER</u>. You <u>must</u> have Reader on your computer. Preview (a MAC product) and other pdf readers <u>will not</u> work on encrypted materials.
- <u>COMPUTER OPERATING SYSTEM</u>. Please update your's now, and then do not update again until the semester is complete. Ditto with Adobe Reader: obtain it now and do not update. Nearly <u>all</u> electronic issues are triggered by software updates. I have <u>always</u> solved compatibility issues, but sometimes that takes hours or days/weeks. If you acquire a new computer or if you have a crash, I will understand; otherwise, please <u>update now</u> and then wait until finals are complete. FTLOG, do not update during finals!!!!

QUIZ points may appear arbitrary, but they mean something <u>to me</u>: they identify what you miss.
- <u>Caution</u>: Most material appears both in the TEXT and in the LESSONS; however, some is in only one place. Some PRACTICE PROBLEMS, QUIZ ANSWERS, or LESSON LINKS contain explanations not fully covered elsewhere. <u>You are responsible for all</u>.
